Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to Government Ayurvedic Medical College & Dhawantari Road, Bangalore, Urban Bengaluru-560009, Karnataka (Inst. ID-AYU0048) with 80 seats [instead of 100 seats] in UG (BAMS) and with 44 PG seats [instead of 45] in 07 courses namely i) Dravyaguna- 07 seats, ii) Panchakarma- 07, iii) Shalya tantra- 07 seats, iv) Shalakyia Tantra (Netra Roga)- 06 seats [instead of 7 seats], v) Roga Nidanam- 06 seats, vi) Rachana Shariram- 05 seats & vii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya kalpana-06 seats under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24- regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Government Ayurvedic Medical College & Dhawantari Road, Bangalore, Urban Bengaluru-560009, Karnataka (Inst. ID-AYU0048)**, inspection of your College was conducted on **15.05.2023 & 16.05.2023 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **Conditional Permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 45 PG seats in 07 courses namely i) Dravyaguna- 07 seats, ii) Panchakarma- 07, iii) Shalya tantra- 07 seats, iv) Shalakyia Tantra (Netra Roga)- 07 seats, v) Roga Nidanam- 06 seats, vi) Rachana Shariram- 05 seats & vii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya kalpana- 06 seats, for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

1) Teaching staffs

- Availability of **total teaching staff for UG** is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{36}{45} \times 100\% = 80\%$ (Excluding Excess)
- There is shortcoming of **05 Professors and 04 Readers** in UG.
- The College is not fulfilling the criteria of minimum 19 Higher faculties distributed in 14 departments** since there is no any Higher faculty in the dept. Of Agada tantra.
- There is no higher faculty and lower faculty for PG in the department of Rachana Sharira.
- There is no lower faculty for PG in the department of Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana.

2) Functionality of hospital:-

- Average bed occupancy is short by 3.74%.**

- In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **42nd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **07.06.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 15.06.2023** to appear on **23.06.2023** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 22 PG seats in 45 PG seats in 07 courses namely i) Dravyaguna- 07 seats, ii) Panchakarma- 07, iii) Shalya tantra- 07 seats, iv) Shalakyia Tantra (Netra Roga)- 07 seats, v) Roga Nidanam- 06 seats, vi) Rachana Shariram- 05 seats & vii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya kalpana- 06 seats, for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied.** The college was directed to make written

submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. GAMC/13/NCISM/MED/2022-23 dated 21.06.2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them.

4. Whereas, the college through its representative, **Dr. Surekha S Medikeri, Principal**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **23.06.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the proposed Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

GAMC/13/NCISM/MED/2022-23 dated 21.06.2023</p> <p>With reference to teaching staff it is mentioned that the institution has a shortage of five professors and four readers (Total of nine higher faculty) for UG program. However, three teachers who are professors are still shown as associate professors in part one. Hence the actual deficiency stands as two professors and seven readers. Actual department wise teaching staff list with names and Teacher's code is attached as Annexure-1.</p> <p>The shortage of one higher and one lower faculty in PG department of Rachana sharira, and one lower faculty in PG Department of Rasashastra exists . The details of actual shortage of teacher in all Departments is shown in Annexure-2.</p> <p>The shortage of teachers is brought to the notice of Government of Karnataka through A YUSH Directorate. Commissioner A YUSH Department has requested the Karnataka Government for the recruitment of teachers. The communication letters are attached as Annexure-3. Hence these posts will be filled by Karnataka public service commission after the approval by the Government of Karnataka.</p>	<p>Dr. Surekha S Medikeri Principal attended the hearing</p> <p>1. 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7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Conditional Permission is issued to Government Ayurveda Medical college & Hospital New Sayyajirao Road Mysuru (Mysore) Pin- 583101, Karnataka (Inst. ID-AYU0046) with 80 seats [instead of 100 seats] in UG (BAMS) course and 44 seats [instead of 45 seats] in 07 PG Courses namely (i) Dravyaguna -07 seats (ii) Panchakarma - 07 seats (iii) Roga Nidanam -06 seats (iv) Rachana Shariram -05 Seats (v) Shalya tantra -07 seats and (vi) Shalakya Tantra(Netra Roga)-06 seats (instead of 07 seats) (vii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya kalpana -06seats for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**

(i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 80 seats [instead of 100 seats] in UG and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 44 seats [instead of 45 seats]** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

9. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or subsequent academic year.**

10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 **and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:**

- (i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- (iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
- (iv) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016.

12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
